## E. Sky Ranch / BTB Partnership – Behavioral Interventionist **Behavioral Coordinator**

This full-time position will be a one-year pilot project and will be housed with and supervised by Sky Ranch Behavioral Services, in partnership with Beyond the Bell. The position will work with at-risk youth in the Sioux City Community School District's middle schools and elementary schools during the school day, and will utilize Beyond the Bell afterschool time to meet with groups of students and conduct family engagement activities benefitting the student and their families, while also considering that time as part of Beyond the Bell's middle school program. The position will focus on African American/Black students and families but will serve all students in need. The position will work alongside the Beyond the Bell family engagement team to help plan and participate in those events. This position will be partially funded with Beyond the Bell's 21st Century grant funds from North Middle, West Middle and some elementary schools (if applicable), with supplemental funding coming from Beyond the Bell administrative funds or Stabilization funds from 7/1/24 – 6/30/25. Sustainability will be sought to continue the position beyond the pilot year.

SHIP is currently using QuickBooks Desktop for our Finance and Payroll management. Since the summer of 2023, we have experienced many issues with payroll and data files, which in turn took very many staff hours to resolve.

To decrease our risk of a compromised file using the Desktop version of QuickBooks, we are looking to upgrade to QuickBooks Online Advanced and Elite Payroll to be in place July 1st 2024.

b. Siouxland Street Project

The Siouxland Street Project Community Meeting was held Tuesday, May 14<sup>th</sup> at the Sioux City Public Museum. The consensus was that that the homeless situation downtown has become more aggressive. This meeting was facilitated by Deb Burnight with the focus on solutions.

The group divided into 3 sub-committees of areas of concern:

- Intensive case management
- Crime issues
- Relocation of services

The group reconvened to discuss next steps for the Street Project Coalition to further investigate.

c. Finances Mindy Baylor Mindy shared financials for the entire organization through 4/30/24.

d. Overtime rules change

The U.S. Department of Labor will increase the minimum salary requirements for exempt/salary employees in two stage over 6 months: the standard salary level will increase from \$684 a week (\$35,568 per year) to \$844 per week (\$43,888 annually) effective July 1, 2024 and then \$1,128 per week (\$58,656 annually) effective January 1, 2025.

This increase will affect a few SHIP employees on July 1<sup>st</sup>, and even more on January 1,2025. Employees under the exempt minimum salary will be required to earn overtime. SHIP will work on a plan with programs and supervisors to either move affected employees to non-exempt status, or increase salaries to the minimum amount.

e. Beyond the Bell update

Beyond the Bell partnered with the Iowa Extension Master Gardeners to host a fun filled night for families at our 21st CCLC locations. We had roughly 35 families attend, and they learned how to plant and take care of a mixture of vegetables, flowers, and herbs. Each family was then able to take their pots home. This partnership will continue throughout our summer program.
